POLICY #3280

METER LOOP POLICY

A. Meter Loop Purchases and Sales

Meter loops can be purchased through the District. The cost of the new meter loop will be the actual average cost or latest purchase price of materials, whichever is higher, plus 25% for handling and stores expense. The District will try to provide the lowest cost possible to the customer. See Fee Schedule 3500.3280-A

B. All-Electric Homes (including trailer houses)

For all-electric homes (electric furnace/electric water heater, heat pump-regardless of backup system/electric water heater), the customer is responsible for purchasing the meter loop. The District will rebate a portion of the cost of the meter loop to the customer according to Fee Schedule 3500.3280-B, upon the verification of electric heat.

C. Any Uprate with Trade-In Meter Loops

The District will take trade-in of used meter loops in good condition and an appraisal of the loop will be made according to Fee Schedule 3500.3280-C.

D. Change Without Uprate

Customers that have a 200-amp or larger meter loop and request a change to an equivalent size meter loop with a double-throw switch will pay the cost of conversion as follows:

Cost of new loop:	See part A
Changeover charge:	See Fee Schedule 3500.3280-D
Credit for trade-in:	See part C

E. Maintenance

Maintenance on meter loops will be provided as follows:

All-Electric Homes: For District-owned meter loops installed before January 1, 2012, the District will furnish the cost of labor, materials, and overheads. If uprate is for electric heat, we will use the trade-in value according to 3500.3280-C. If loop is replaced due to failure, the District will replace the loop, which then becomes the property of the customer.

For customer-owned meter loops, the actual cost of materials plus 25% stores will be charged.

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
